



College Working System and Hours

- The Working day is divided into two sessions. The forenoon session has 3 periods (9.15 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.) and the afternoon session has 2 periods (1.30 p.m. to 3.30 p.m.)
- The College follows day order system. Days are denoted by Roman numerals such as I, II, III, IV, V and VI and the time table is followed accordingly. The first day order will be followed on the re-opening day. The second day order will be the next working day and so on.
- Student should not leave the class room during class hours and in case, should get prior permission from the concerned Department Head.

Principal's Office

Students can meet the Principal before 9.15 am and during the interval and lunch hours and after 3.30 pm only. Students are restricted to meet the Principal during class hours. The Office will be working from 9.00 am to 5.30 pm and the lunch hour is from 12.30 pm to 1.30 pm.

Admission Rules & Regulations

- 1. Application for admission should be submitted only in the prescribed form available in the college office.
- 2. All admissions are made as per the guidelines prescribed by the affiliating University and Government of Tamil Nadu.
- 3. Any student who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily expelled from the college and has to forfeit of all fees paid.
- 4. Any student leaves the college in the middle of any semester, whatsoever be the reason cannot claim remission of any portion of the fee paid in the College.

Attendance

The guidelines of attendance requirement issued by Bharathiar University are adopted by the College. Attendance shall be consider semester wise not annually.

- The student has to secure not less than 75% of attendance for each semester in the total number of working days during the semester.
- Students with attendance between 55% and 64% are not eligible to appear for the current semester examinations and permitted to redo the semester.
- Students shall submit leave application for specific reasons.
- Leave application should be authorized by the parent/guardian/deputy warden/class advisor in advance.
- Students with Medical reason shall produce the Medical Certificate from a registered practitioner.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDEN

Behaviour

- Any requisition or letter by the student to the Principal should con through the HOD or Class Advisor.
- Eve-teasers will be dismissed from the College.
- Students should refrain from participating in political or communal activities.
- Students are solely responsible for their own personal belongings.
- No meeting should be held in the campus without prior permission from the Principal.
- No donations should be collected from students by any student without pri permission from the Management.
- Two wheelers and four wheelers owned by the students should be parked the appropriate place (Vehicles parking shed).

Identity Card

A Photographic ID Card with Principal Signature will be issued to the students. Students have to wear the ID Card all the time when they are in the Campus. Students should carry the ID Card at all times and they may be required to produce the ID Card for

- Access to Library, Laboratory, Bank and other office operations.
- Admission to examination.
- In the office to receive Scholarship, Certificates and other travel concessions and etc.

Students who have lost their ID card may obtain the Duplicate ID Card on Payment from the Administrative Office.

Disciplinary Code

- Students should wear their ID card every day. ID Cards should be produced anytime when demanded.
- Students are strictly prohibited to enter into other class rooms.
- Smoking, use of drugs or liquor is strictly prohibited inside the campus and violators will be dismissed with immediate effect.
- The Students shall strictly have a driving license and wear helmet (both rider and pillion passenger) when they come to the college in two wheelers.
- Students are advised not to bring valuable things like ornaments, heavy cash, electronic gadgets etc. Management is not responsible for any theft or valuables or cash inside/outside the campus.
- Absolute silence should be maintained while moving from class room to laboratory/library/auditorium and also coming back to class rooms.

Examinations

- Students having a minimum of 75% of attendance in the practical classes alone will be eligible to submit their record note books and appear for the Practical Examinations. Students shall be permitted to appear for the Practical Examinations only with the submission of bonafide records.
- Hall Tickets will be issued to students in their respective departments, a week before the commencement of the University Examinations.
- **During Examinations** Candidates should bring the following without fail: Hall **Ticket and ID Card.** Those who fail to bring the above will not be allowed to enter the examination hall.

Examinations

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The College was established with three under graduate programmes and currently it has 23 Under Graduate programmes and 14 Post graduate programmes. Eight Departments are recognized for Research activity leading to M.Phil, and Ph.D. Degrees. STRUCTURE OF THE PROGRAMMES

Under Graduate Programmes

(B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com / B.Com (CA) / B.C.A.)

The College follows the semester pattern requiring six semesters of study for Bachelor's degree. The duration of the semester is 90 working days. In the CBCS each course offered in a semester is assigned a certain number of credits, depending on the quantum of work required of the student.

At undergraduate level a student must necessarily complete a minimum of 14 credits for Bachelor's Degree. The UG programme has the following components:

Part - I

Tamil or any one of the following modern/classical languages i.e. Malayalam, Hind French, German.

The subject shall be offered during the first four semesters with one examination the end of each semester (4 courses -16 credits).

Part - II: English

The subject shall be offered during the first four semesters with one examination the end of each semester (4 courses -16 credits). During second semester, part English shall be offered as Communication Skills.

Part - III

Core Subject

As prescribed in the scheme of examination.

Examination shall be conducted in the core subjects at the end of every semester For the programmes with 4 semester languages : 15 core courses – 60 credits are be offered

Allied Subjects

As prescribed in the scheme of Examination, four subjects, one each in I, II, III and IV semester for a total of 16 credits are to be offered.

Electives courses

Three elective courses with 12 credits are to be offered one in the V semester and two in the VI Semester. Elective subjects are to the selected from the list of electives prescribed by the Board of Studies concerned

Part - IV

1(a) Those who have not studied Tamil upto X std / XII std and taken a non-Tamil language under Part-I shall take Tamil comprising of two courses with 2 credits each (4 credits). The course content of which shall be equivalent to that prescribed for the 6th standard by the Board of Secondary Education and they shall be offered in the third and fourth semesters.

There shall be no Comprehensive (University) Examinations and the students shall be assured as per the scheme of Continuous Assessment (CA) for the total marks prescribed.

(OR)

(b) Those who have studied Tamil upto XII std and taken a non-Tamil language under Part-I shall take Advanced Tamil comprising of two courses with 2 credits each (4 credits) in the third and fourth semesters.

(OR)

- (c) Others who do not come under the above a+b categories can choose the following non-major electives comprising of two courses with 2 credits each (4 credits) in the third and fourth semesters.
 - 1) Yoga for Human Excellence / Women's Rights / Constitution of India (III semester.)
 - 2) General Awareness (IV semester.)

2. Skill Based Subjects:

All the UG programmes shall offer of four courses of Skill Based Subjects one each in III, IV, V & VI semester with 3 credits each (12 credits) for which examination shall be conducted at the end of the respective semesters.

Environmental Studies:

All the UG programmes shall offer a course in Environmental Studies Subjects 3. All the UG programmes Shall one shall be conducted at and it shall be offered in the first semester. Examination shall be conducted at the end of the semester (one course with 2 credits).

Value Education : 4.

All the UG programmes shall offer a course in "Value Education - Human All the UG programmes shall be offered in the second semester. Examination shall be offered in the second semester. The assessment for the category in Part – IV 1 (b) & (c) and 3, 4 subjects shall the assessment for the satisfactory (University) Examination for the total marks be through Comprehensive (University) prescribed. There shall be no Continuous Assessment (CA).

Internship: Internship is a specialized field training programme required to be attached to an industry as an in-house internee for a period prescribed by the Boan of study concerned. At the end of the training Programme, each student should submit a "Internship Report" for examination

The Course of the Degree of Master of Science/Arts/Commerce shall be under the Semester System according to the Syllabus to be prescribed by university from tim to time. The semester system consists of FOUR semesters of study. A student $^{\mbox{\scriptsize mus}}$ necessarily complete a minimum of 90 credits for a M.A. / M.Sc. / M.Com. / MI Degree.

Project: Each student admitted to the Programme of study shall take up a project work in lieu of three Elective courses. The report of the study should be submitted at the end of course of study certified by the supervisor and duly forwarded by the Head of the Department/Principal of the College.

The Head of the concerned department shall assign a project supervisor, whose intern to assign the topic and monitor the project work of the student.

Continuous Assessment (CA)

- CA will be carried out by the course teachers.
- A Students are expected to take all testing units that are administered to them
 i.e., 3 tests and additional third components which may include
 seminar/Assignment/Project work/any other.
- The testing units carry equal weight. Seminar / Paper presentation is a requirement at postgraduate level.

- There is no minimum mark required for passing in the Continuos Assessment.
- Retests will be given only for those students who have missed the test because of participation in college-sponsored activities such as NSS Sports These tests will be held before the commencement of the Comprehensive Examination.

Comprehensive Examination

- Assessment will be in the form of a Comprehensive Examination in each semester.
- A student will be permitted to take the Comprehensive Examinations provider
 he/she has a minimum attendance of 75% and has completed the Continuous
 Assessment requirements of test/assignments/ seminars / project work, etc.

SCHOLARSHIP


