The institute has a mechanism for internal and external audit. We have our own internal audit mechanism ongoing continuous process in addition to the external auditors to verify and certify the entire Internal Capital Expenditure of the Institute each year. Qualified Internal Auditors from external resources are appointed and a team of staff under them do a thorough check and verification of all vouchers of the expenditure put out in each financial year. Likewise an external audit is also carried out on an elaborate way where all institutional accounts are audited regularly by both Internal and statutory audits. So far there have been no objections. Minor errors or omissions and commissions when pointed out by the audit team are immediately corrected and precautionary steps are taken to avoid recurrence of such errors in future. The institute regularly maintains a sound financial audit system. The task of financial management and inspection is entrusted with the finance committee constituted by the Governing Body. The Principal who is the chairman of the committee convenes the meetings at periodic intervals where accounts relating to previous year are carefully scrutinized prior to the preparation of the budget for the current academic year and the same is presented before the Governing Body for approval. For the preparation of institutional budget by the finance committee, the department budgets are collected from all academic departments. These budgets are scrutinized and consolidated to make the annual budget of the college. The chairman also oversees the statutory audit of the accounts maintained by the college. With regard to internal audit, the college
