
Eligibility

Group Project:


- The students will be divided into small groups.

1 Concurrent Field Work - II

Students will be placed in Urban/Rural/Slum communities, schools/old age homes/counselling centres/rehabilitation settings etc. to understand its nature, structure, dynamics, differences, problems and challenges. The programme aims to facilitate learning experience through village visits, conducting group discussions in the community and case interviews. It provides an opportunity to the students to assess the needs of the community and come up with suitable social work intervention. The following guidelines and strategies are followed in community Social Work:

- 1. Importance to be given for the practice of Social Work methods
- 2. Resource mapping with communities has to be planned and executed
- General Group discussion with the community people / conducting base -line surveys.
- 4. To take part in the programmes organized by the voluntary organizations

2 Rural/Tribal Camp

In the second semester students should attend 7 days Rural/tribal camp. Expected learning during camp should be with the following aspects:

- Camp for 7 days is compulsory for the I MSW in their locality
- Micro-planning activity and Participatory Rural/tribal Appraisal (PRA) activity shall be the part of Rural/Tribal camp.
- Students should prepare a detailed camp report and submit it to their respective faculty supervisor.
